NEW CHAPTER 943 ENACTED

Mr. Newell introduced Ordinance No. 2018-51 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING NEW CHAPTER 943, "SMALL CELL DESIGN GUIDELINES" OF THE STREETS AND PUBLIC SERVICES CODE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Moved by Mr. Newell, seconded by Mrs. Evans that the requirement for reading an ordinance three times be suspended. Carried. Ayes: DeBernardo, Evans, Lipp, Newell, Rogoff. Nays: None. Moved by Mr. Newell, seconded by Mrs. Evans that the ordinance be adopted. Carried. Ayes: DeBernardo, Evans, Lipp, Newell, Rogoff. Nays: None. Mr. Newell said this was discussed at the Utilities Committee meeting prior to this meeting and we were encouraged to pass this to prevent cellular service providers from being able to come into the village and install equipment without guidelines. Mrs. DeBernardo said state legislation will go into effect July 31, 2018 and we currently have no guidelines for this. This can be reviewed and amended.

NEW CHAPTER 941 ENACTED

Mr. Newell introduced Ordinance No. 2018-52 entitled:

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING NEW CHAPTER 941 "USE OF PUBLIC WAYS FOR SMALL CELL WIRELESS FACILITIES AND WIRELESS SUPPORT STRUCTURES" OF THE STREETS AND PUBLIC SERVICES CODE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Ms. Rogoff said this companion ordinance is also going into effect state-wide July 31, 2018. Mr. Markowitz said this regulates how you get your permits. It provides for applications, information, and time lines as to when and who you would use. The Utilities Committee pointed out that we don't define what Type 1, 2, & 3 Applications are in Section 941.08(a) so I recommended that we add a provision that any term that is capitalized in the ordinance that is not defined in the ordinance would have the meaning set forth in substitute House Bill 478. We can add that into the chapter under definition, Section 941.01(b). Ms. Rogoff said this also can be reviewed and amended.

Upon further investigation we realized that our roads are in bad shape and while we were having meetings with the residents we noticed quite a bit of storm water ponding in different parts so we made this a priority in our Capital Improvement Plan for 2018. We did receive a zero interest loan for \$1,235,000. This project is scheduled to begin this Fall. The Utilities Committee unanimously voted to recommend this to Council.
