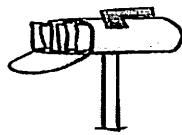
BRUSH COLLECTION

The Village of Chagrin Falls provides brush and tree limb collection through our refuse collection hauler, Kimble Company. Kimble will collect your brush and tree limbs on your regular refuse collection day when tied in bundles weighing no more than 50 pounds each and cut to lengths of four feet or less. Small amounts of loose material can be placed in your refuse cart. The Village does not offer a chipping service.



LEAF COLLECTION

The Village of Chagrin Falls offers leaf collection during the fall only. No spring collection is provided. Chagrin Falls Street Department typically begins annual leaf pick-up the second week of October and completes the program in late November weather permitting. Crews start at the south end of town and work towards the north end. Leaves should be piled in long **windrows within 4 feet** of the curb on the tree lawn wherever possible. On streets with ditches, leaves should be raked as close to the road as possible in windrows, but not blocking the ditch. Leaves should not be raked into the street as they will cause drainage problems or will be pushed off if we have snow. **Branches, twigs, and flower cuttings must not be put** in the leaf piles as they will clog up the vacuum equipment and slow down the pick-up considerably.



MAILBOXES

Wood mailbox enclosures rot over time and become weak. "Step 2" mailboxes become brittle in the cold weather. Tell your private snow plow driver not to push snow against or to the mailbox side of your drive. When the Village plows come by it can shift the pile and cause damage to your mailbox and post. Homeowners are advised to keep the mailbox assembly in good condition. The force of the snow and ice thrown from the Village plow truck contributes largely to the damage. The Village is not liable from snow and ice coming off a plow and damaging a mailbox.

TRASH CANS & TOTES

Weekly trash pickup containers must be placed to the side of your driveway. Handles should face your house. Do not place containers in the roadway, cul-de-sacs or blocking a sidewalk.

SNOWPLOWING

The Village of Chagrin Falls and its Service Department takes great pride in keeping our roadways clear and safe for the winter season. The Service Department will plow and salt in a priority system. Plowing of primary roads will be addressed first, then secondary roads will be plowed and salted as the driver's route dictates. Plowing of cul-de-sacs will be addressed once the primary and secondary roads are clear and safe.

No person shall sweep, shovel or pile or, being the owner, occupant or person having care of any building or lot of land bordering any street, sidewalk, alley or other public place, permit or cause the sweeping, **shoveling or piling of any snow, ice**, leaves, branches, twigs, brush or grass upon any street, alley or public place. (Ord. 1963-558. Passed 2-11-63.)

SIDEWALK SHOVELING



This is a reminder that the Village of Chagrin Falls has an Ordinance in regards to the removal of snow and ice from sidewalks. **The ORDINANCE READS AS FOLLOWS:**
543.02 REMOVAL OF ICE AND SNOW FROM SIDEWALKS.

It shall be the duty of the owner of each and every parcel of real estate in the Municipality abutting upon any sidewalk to keep such sidewalk abutting his premises free and clear of snow and ice and to remove there from all snow and ice accumulated thereon within a reasonable time.

"Reasonable time" means removal of the snow and ice within two hours after the most Recent accumulation of ice or snow, or if during the night, two hours after sunrise, or, if Noticed by the Municipality, within two hours of such notice. Notice is adequate whether oral Or written and served upon the owner or occupant, or posted in writing on the main entrance Of the premises. (Ord. 1987-44. Passed 10-26-87.)



NO OVERNIGHT PARKING

No person shall park or permit any vehicle to be parked on any street or municipal parking lot between the hours of 2 A.M and 6 A.M. on any day, except emergency and public safety vehicles and physicians on call. (Ord. 1983-32. Passed 5-8-89.)
